This is a quick catch-up with a couple of things to mention. I need to check that your received and noticed Andrew's GDPR email and I am taking the opportunity to welcome our latest Police service to the Alert family and show off a bit about our new training package.

1) GDPR Decisions to be made

On the 28th March, our MD, Andrew Sawford sent a notification to all Dev Board members advising about the choices you are facing regarding updated required to the system due to GDPR. This is after some exhaustive research and several discussions with the ICO and consultation with the Dev Board GDPR working group. You can review our notification <u>here</u> and keep an eye on all updates over the next few weeks in the specific GDPR section of our Help Centre <u>here</u>.

Basically, we have a load of fairly obvious tweaks and modifications to make to the registration processes, mainly involving removing any pre-ticked options and ensuring that we provide and audit

members opt in actions. We are cracking on with lots of hidden tweaks over the next two weeks and I will advise you when those have been done.

More importantly and certainly more relevant to you is the decision you need to make about whether you require your entire database to opt in again. Andrew has laid out three options for you to consider. In simple terms, we have established a default position whereby we are confident that each original database was obtained in a fair and lawful manner and does not need removing or restarting. If you are not as confident and require an opt-in process then this can be accommodated by two methods, one managed by you and one as a fully managed service by us (at a cost). All this is explained in Andrew's notification <u>here</u>. We are looking to get a response from each force lead by the 9th April 2018 please.
