

for use when out and about. This makes it much simpler to see where the best local locations to head to next are, to meet the objectives of the priority plan.

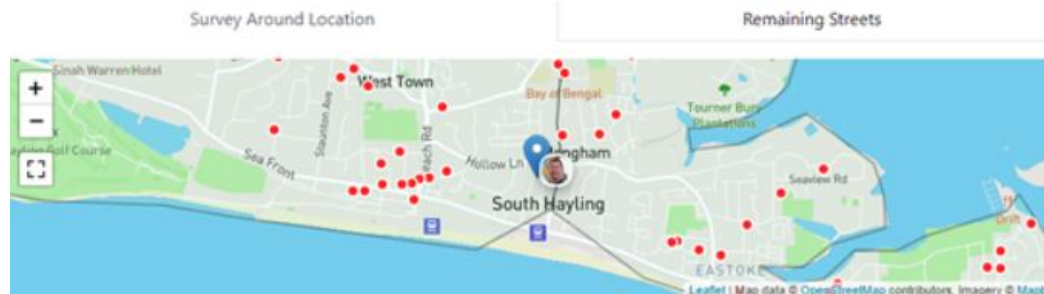
The Community planning map in Rapport now includes red pins above all the remaining (unvisited) target addresses. Officers can simply head to the clusters of red pins.

In addition, when working in small teams, PCSOs can quickly lose track of each other, especially when the public invite colleagues into their homes. Additional markers now show the last known address that a colleague visited **within the last 30 minutes**. It should be emphasized to front line officers that this is not an additional form of tracking, it has been requested by PCSOs in the field as an aide to their role.

Thanks to Hampshire and Northamptonshire forces for agreeing to test these new facilities over the next two weeks. We will make any suggested modifications to timings and range as they feed back their findings.

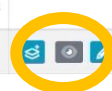
3 Survey Module (Community View) Creation Tools

4 Use of Cookies on the Platform

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site. The table below explains the cookies we use and why.

We do not store user identifiable data or tracking information in any site cookies and we do not share or sell any data gathered from cookies or any other process.

Cookie	Name	Type	Duration	Purpose
Cookie Consent	cookieConsent	Essential	1 year	This cookie is used to store your acceptance for use of non-essential cookies on this site.
Culture	Culture	Essential	1 month	This cookie is used to store your language preference for our websites that are multilingual.
Antiforgery	Antiforgery	Essential	Session	This is a security cookie used to prevent Cross-Site Request Forgery (CSRF) Attacks.
Login	Cookies	Essential	Session	This is used to keep you logged in to the system.
SessionId	SessionId	Essential	Session	User, device, and session ID cookies along with timestamp cookies for timing out sessions after inactivity.
